

Installation Guide

Self-Adhesive Tiles & Planks

Vinyl plank flooring is a stylish, durable and cost-effective option that can transform the look of your home. This DIY guide provides easy-to-follow instructions to help you install flooring in your home ensuring a professional appearance without needing to call the experts. Let's get started on your home improvement journey!

Tools & Materials



Tools:

- Broom
- Chalk
- Extension pole
- Measuring tape
- Pencil
- Roller
- Sandpaper
- Utility knife

Materials:

- Floor primer
- Levelling compound
- Patching compound

Check your flooring

Before you start, inspect the product and set aside any damaged planks.



2

Prepare the substrate and fix any surface irregularities

Clean the substrate thoroughly and use a levelling or patching compound to fix any surface irregularities. Sand or plane down high spots as needed.



3

Apply floor primer

Once the surface is level and clean, use a roller and extension pole to apply a diluted water-based floor primer. This will improve the adhesion of the vinyl planks and prevent lifting. Let the primer dry for at least 24 hours before moving on to the next step.



4

Plan the layout

Measure and divide the room in half, creating a straight guide with a chalk line. Begin laying the planks from the centre of the room.



5

Begin laying the planks

Peel off the protective backing paper and press each plank firmly onto the floor. Lay the planks in a staggered pattern, ensuring the final plank in each row is at least 300mm long.



6

Make cuts for obstacles

Measure and mark planks to fit around obstacles like door frames or pipes. Use a utility knife to cut the planks to the right shape and size.



7

Cut planks for room edges

For room edges, measure the distance between the last full plank and the wall, then score and snap the planks to size. Position the cut edge against the wall and ensure a snug fit.



8

Apply pressure to set the planks

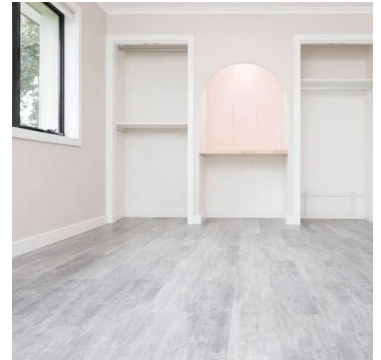
Once all planks are laid, use a floor roller or rolling pin to apply even pressure across the entire floor, ensuring the planks adhere firmly.



9

Add finishing touches

Install skirting boards around the room's perimeter to cover any gaps and give the room a neat, professional finish.



Maintenance Tips

- Regularly sweep or vacuum to remove dirt and debris.
- Clean up spills immediately to prevent damage.
- Use a damp mop for cleaning but avoid excessive water.
